Synchronous Distance Learning

- Occurs in real time between participants
- Various modalities
 - Chat
 - E-mail in real-time
 - Video-conferencing
- Scheduled

Asynchronous Distance Learning

- · Learners engage with material at own pace
- Information may be more static than real time
- Discussion occurs in forums
- May be a delay in response or clarification
- Scalability
- **❖**TEXTBOOK??

Mixed-modalities

- On line materials provided to all learners
- Scheduled 'real time' interactions
- Learners create resources for later real time discussions
- "Create your own adventure"
