Introduction: One of the commonest Public Health Disasters in Eastern Africa is fires. These are also a common emergency at district level. The most important aspect of fire control is prevention and mitigation. In the event of fire, it is very important that the response is prompt and orderly. In this session, we shall review the basic principles of fire control and management.

Issue for Brain Storming (5 to 10 Minutes)

Fires are a very common Public Health problem in Eastern Africa. In Kenya and Tanzania, several incidents of school fires have been reported. In Uganda, over 30 incidents were reported in a 3 month period in 2008. Unfortunately, a good proportion of institutional fires are started intentionally. More importantly though, the vulnerability of people and properly is increased by the fact that most school buildings are ill-constructed, congested and there are no fire management procedures.
