11.	We do this by ensuring that resources are available to cope with a threat and to resist the impact of a hazard	
12.	It is the occurence of a health related event in excess of what is expected in a particular community in a given period of time	
13.	A French term meaning 'pick and sort' or 'select and categorise'. It involves classifying victims in order to assign priorities for urgency of case handling	
14.	People with this code need to be given the first priority at the accident scene	
15.	It is assessed by checking for the radial pulse or capillary refill	
16.	Its characteristics include violence, massive displacement, administrative and political collapse and worsening of civil differences	
17.	It is assessed by determining if a patient can follow simple commands	
18.	This class of fire involves combustible gases such as methane, propane and butane which can produce explosions	
19.	A meeting point of first responders such as fire engines, ambulance and fire fighters	
20.	We do this by removing people from an areas of danger to a safe assemply point, in an orderly manner
