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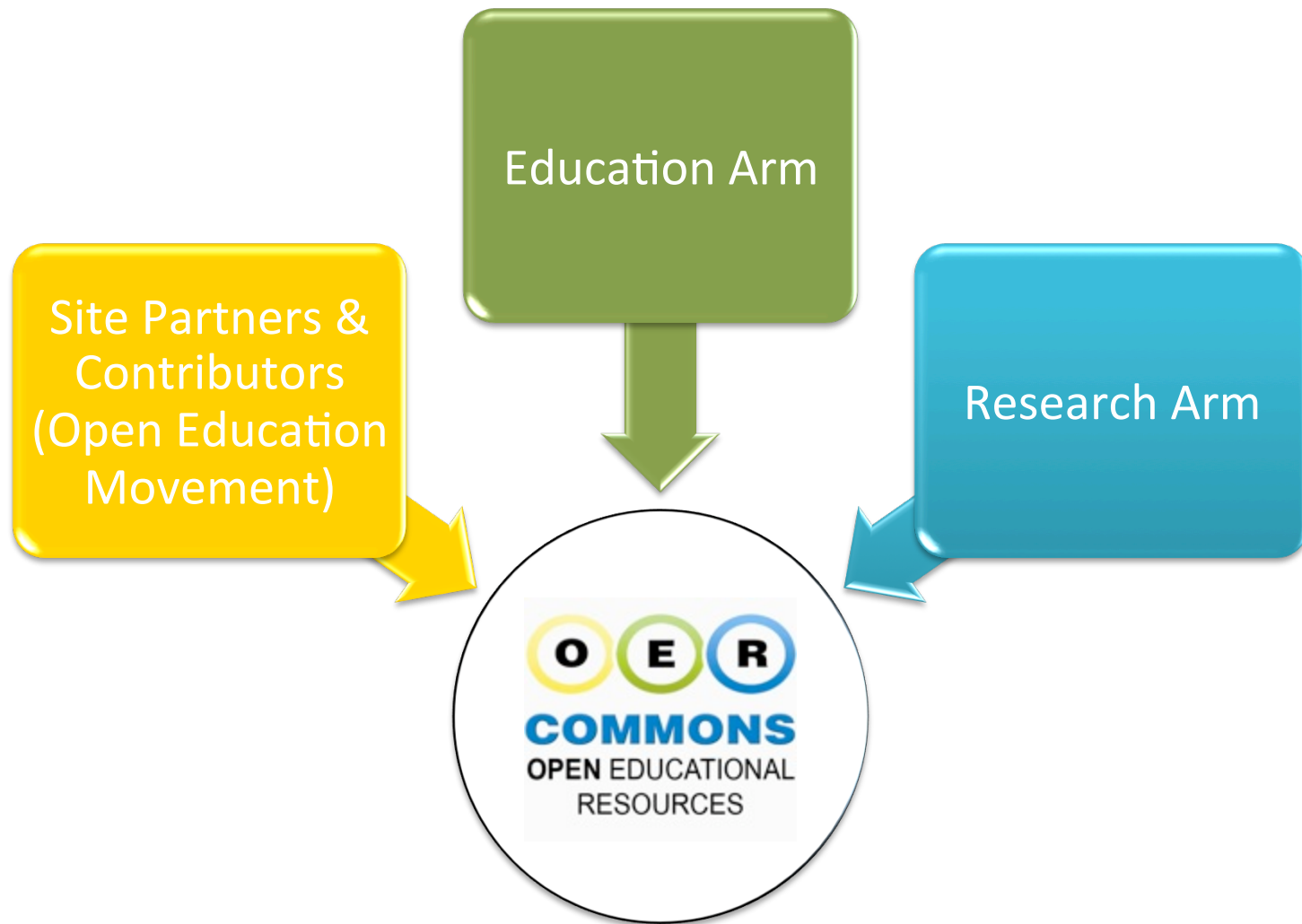
Open Educational Resources Learning Network started in 2007 with Support from the Hewlett Foundation
