

















Selected Medical & Public Health databases.....

Global Health/Global Health Archive (Database)

- international health, biomedical life sciences, noncommunicable diseases, public health nutrition, food safety and hygiene
- serials, books, book chapters, reports, conference proceedings, discussion papers, newsletters, patents, and theses
- 2 million records, 1910-present

- International reproductive health covering
 - family planning technology and programs,

Facts & Figures

World Bank Data

- over 2000 indicators from the World Bank data sets including
 - World Development Indicators
 - Millennium Development Goals Indicators
 - Global Development Finance
 - Health Nutrition and Population Statistics

UN Data

- official statistics produced by countries and compiled by the UN data system
- covers agriculture, education, energy, industry, labour, national accounts, population and tourism
- Includes indicators such as Millennium Development Goals

UN Gender Info 2007

 gender statistics and indicators on a wide range of policy areas, including: population, families, health, education, work, and political participation. What data can I gather about CO₂ emissions from World Bank Data?

What information can I find on UN Data about access to drinking water?

How does the maternal mortality ratio in Ghana and Canada compare according to UN Gender Info 2007?

- includes newspapers, radio, TV broadcasts
- full text in English
- Time span: last 3 years

Access World News

- > 600 US newspapers and > 260 English language newspapers from around the world
- Full text in English
- Time span: 1999-present (varies with title)
