The Savage Ailies of England.

The following letter from a British officer, published in the last Gentiael, affords official proof that the English have subsidized and entitled their red brethren to fight against the U. States; and that the principal force at the capture of the American fort Michelimackinae, was composed of ruthless Indians !

BRITISH ACCOUNTS.

MONTREAR, (L. C.) Aug. 4, 1812.—The following letters have been received from U. Canada: "Makinac, July 18, 1819.

"Dear Six - I am happy to have it in my power to annuance to you, that Fort Mackinac capitulated to us on the 17th inft. at 11 o'clock, A. M. Captain Roberts at our head, with part of the 10th

rived. It was a fortunate circumflance that the fort capitulated without firing a fingle gun, for had they done fo, I firmly believe not a foul of them would have been faved. My fon, Charles Longlade, Augustine Nolin, and Michelle Cadotte, jun. have rendered me great fervice in keeping the Indians in order, and executing from time to time such commands

as were delivered to me by the commanding officer.

I never faw so determined a set of people as the Chippewas and Attawas were.

Since the capitulation, they have not drank a single drup of liquor, nor even killed a spall helonging to any person. (a thing never known before) for they generally destroy every thing they meet with. I am, dear fir, your obedient servant,
